Budva

Budva – and ancient towns at Adriatic sea has a rich historical background. The Budva coast, also called Budvansk Riviera is 37 km long with 17 main beaches. The climate in Budva is typically Mediterranean, with hot dry summers and mild winters. Budva has 2.300 sunny hours per year.

Flora and fauna in Budva are similar to all other coastal towns in Montenegro. In Budva there are palm trees, oleanders, mimosas and wild and domestic pomegranates, figs, oranges, mandarins, grapes and olive trees. Rare examples of flowers and decorative trees are cultivated there.

Budva and Budva's riviera is located in the center of the Montenegro coast between 42 10' - 42 20' north latitude and 18 49' - 19 00' east longitude.

For many, a holiday to the world renowned beaches of the middle coast of Montenegro would be heaven enough, but any one who wants a little diversity may be surprised but what else this region has to offer.

In Budva are plenty of other tantalising beaches along this 37 km stretch of coast Budva Riviera which less expensive and easily reached by car. The waters range in colour from the pale blue sea of Sveti Stefan and Jaz beach to the rich turquoise of Kamenovo Beach and Drobnji Pijesak Beach, which lap against dreamy, olive trees and offer idyllic locations to release any pent up tension.

The coastal area around Budva, called Budvanska rivijera, is the most important centre of Montenegro's tourism industry.

Climate & Weather in Budva

During the winter the temperature at Montenegro coast is mostly between 8-14 C and during summer between 25-34C.

Budva has a mild Mediterranean climate, crystal clear sea water, long beaches, rich flora and fauna, are the reasons having an unforgettable vacation at the Budva Riviera.

The climate along Budvai is a typical Mediterranean one, with mild winters and hot and dry summers. Summer temperatures in July can rise up to 34°C to 36°C. 2300 hours of sunshine a year. Budva ranks among the sunniest towns of southern Europe.
